

Pre-operative Instructions

Please read the following steps/pages to prepare for your surgery.

- 1. Most patients require their insurance company to approve the procedure
 - a. Our staff will begin working on this approval immediately
 - b. Unforeseen delays can occur due to your plan's administrative policies
 - c. Job related/Worker's comp patients have to have approval without exception.
- 2. Out patient surgery
 - a. You may require tests/clearance from your primary doctor
 - b. The below circled tests are requested for your surgery
 - i. EKG Chest X-ray Electrolytes CBC Pregnancy Urine Type & Cross PT/PTT Preop Blood donation Hepatitis HIV
 - c. ***YOU MUST HAVE A FAMILY MEMBER OR FRIEND DRIVE YOU TO AND FROM THE FACILITY ON THE DAY OF SURGERY WITHOUT EXCEPTION***
- 3. In patient surgery (Shoulder/elbow reconstruction)
 - a. You may require tests/clearance from your primary doctor
 - b. The below circled tests are requested for your surgery
 - i. EKG Chest X-ray Electrolytes CBC Pregnancy Urine Type & Cross PT/PTT Preop Blood donation Hepatitis HIV
 - c. We will invite your primary doctor to perform your admission or they may choose a hospitalist to follow you during your stay. They, or the hospitalist will dictate your admitting history and physical exam
- 4. Surgery Clearance
 - a. Be sure to get the circled lab tests completed to ensure no unnecessary delays
 - b. Give yourself and your doctor enough time to accomplish these tests
 - c. Some tests may be done at the hospital on the preadmission date if approved
 - d. EKG and CXR should be hand delivered to the anesthesiologist or preop nurse
- 5. Pre-Registration
 - a. You should pre-register all necessary papers online or in person 1-2 days in advance of your planned surgery. Failure to pre-register will lead to delays
- 6. DO NOT EAT OR DRINK ANYTHING 8 HOURS BEFORE SURGERY AS YOUR SURGERY TIME MAY CHANGE IN THE MORNING, WE SUGGEST TO STOP BY MIDNIGHT.
 - a. Failure to follow the above simple rule can be life-threatening
 - b. You need to stop all non-aspirin blood thinners for FIVE days
 - i. If on aspirin, stop before shoulder/elbow surgery as well.
 - c. A small sip of water can be taken for mandatory medication only (Heart, Diabetes, High blood pressure, seizure med) See further instruction on next page
 - d. Diabetics should get additional advice from primary care how to handle their meds.

- 8. Post-op Visit
 - a. Please confirm your surgical follow-up appointment with our front desk
 - b. Many patients also have therapy appointments at first visit, please confirm as well.



Pre-operative Medication Schedule

Remember: Nothing by Mouth at least 8 hours before surgery*

Only Exceptions:

1. Cardiac/High Blood Pressure Medication

- **a.** Please take all cardiac and anti-hypertension medications the morning of surgery with a very small sip of water.
- **b.** If the medication is normally taken at night, continue same schedule.

2. Diabetics

- **a.** Hold all am oral hypoglycemic (Glucophage/glyburide/amaryl, metformin etc.)
- **b.** Hold all am Regular Insulin
- c. Take ½ dose of NPH/Lente (Long acting) Insulin in am

3. Diuretics

a. Patient may take diuretic in am, especially if necessary for high blood pressure.

4. Asthmatics/COPD

- **a.** Bring inhaler to surgery, so that 2-4 puffs can be taken pre-op there.
- **b.** May take theophylline in am.

5. Reflux/indigestion/Hiatal Hernia Patients

- **a.** Please take H2 blocker (Pepcid, Tagamet, zantac etc.,) and/or prilosec in the am (small sip of water)
- **b.** DO NOT TAKE PARTICULATE ANTACID (MYLANTA/MAALOX)

6. Herbal Medication:

a. Stop all herbal medications, especially St. John's Wort before surgery

7. Pain Medication

a. May take pain meds in am of surgery, but only those that do not contain Aspirin.

8. Aspirin

a. If you are a patient of Dr. Bronstein's, AND are having surgery below the elbow (Hand/Wrist), you can continue your Aspirin up to the day before surgery, and resume after surgery.

ALL OTHER Blood Thinners must be stopped 5 days prior to surgery.

Please Note:

All above approved Medications should ONLY be taken with a small sip of water*

*If you do not follow these instructions your surgery will likely be delayed or cancelled.
